Country Club Hills, IL—As part of the Illinois Association of School Board's Targeting Achievement through Governance (TAG) Program, School Board members from Country Club Hills School District 160 are involved in doing work that allows them to focus on their district policies in a way that will support student learning. The three-hour policy workshop teaches Board Members a process that will help them focus on district-policies in a way that will support student learning. Additional coaching sessions will be scheduled to help the board work with a policy topic that supports District and school improvement efforts.

“The Targeting Student Learning work will lead the District to a better understanding of how our policymaking role and learning in the classroom are connected, and how our policies can impact student achievement,” said President Hutson. “We look forward to being able to incorporate this process into our Board work for the betterment of the District and the community.”

The Illinois Association of School Boards (TAG) program is funded by a grant from the Illinois State Board of Education. The grant provides services and training at no cost to school boards in districts that have been identified as not making adequate yearly progress under the requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind Act and state law.

Materials for the workshop and in-district implementation sessions are provided at no cost to the district through the (TAG) program, a value of up to \$1,800 for the district.
